My dad always taught me to leave everything better than you found it, and as I examined the past three years, I think we've been able to accomplish many exciting improvements, both visible ones and invisible ones.


Over the past three years, we have improved academics and reviewed and recommended the purchase of new curriculum for many subjects and grade levels. We have examined and continue to rewrite the school policy where needed. We have improved the financial standing of the school, created a coffee shop for a gathering space, improved music and arts programs, emphasized faculty development, remodeled the kitchen, began work on the salary scale for teachers, created a strategic plan that has been used to guide the school, hired PK-8 Principal, achieved high marks on the new OPI accreditation system, and established new security systems and building entry procedures. We've instituted MAP testing, allowing us to effectively differentiate education for our students, improved our resource room function, raised money for a new building, and have a well-functioning bus fleet with a new activity bus to safely take our students down the road. We established a Spiritual Life Director position, and most importantly, carried out all of this while staying faithful to our mission and firmly grounded in the Word of God.

I've been thankful to be a part of a great administrative team, with a supportive board and extremely generous and faithful supporters of the school. I am especially thankful for our students who make this place come to life. They are the reason we do this, although sometimes we lose sight of that fact. They will be the ones I miss the most. As I stood outside greeting the kids on the very last day of school, I realized that is what I will miss the most. The smiles, excitement, the families walking their kids in, to give them to us for 8 hours a day. Trusting us to teach them, love them, and model Christ for them. Thank you for your support in that mission, and thank you for allowing the Westas to be a part of this community for the last three years.

How long have you been at MCS? For four years now; I attended Ophir Elementary and Middle school for the six years prior.

What extracurriculars have you been involved in during your time

Use "It's my senior year" as an excuse for everything!


