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

Preseason Reminder

This article was written and published a few years ago, but is worth sharing again as we enter another winter sports season here at MCS. Thank you, Kendal!

"You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." Matthew 5:14-16 ESV.

As we enter the winter sports season, it's important to remember that our basketball players, our coaches, our parents, and our fans all have the same goal. We are all on the same team and our goal is to glorify God through our words and actions on and off the court. We want others to be directed toward Christ by the way we all act.

So, how do our basketball players do that? It could be as simple as leaving the locker rooms cleaner than upon arrival. It could be by helping opponents up after they hit the floor. It could be by showing all-out effort and an intense desire to win. It could be by showing respect to officials, opponents, and to coaches. It could be by emotionally lifting up a dejected teammate. It could be by cleaning up the bus after a road trip. It could be by befriending someone on the other side of the gym. It could be by complementing an opponent on social media rather than tearing them down. It could be by giving full effort and focus whether it's in a November practice or in the State championship game. It could be by showing humility after a comfortable victory or showing an opponent respect after a close loss.

How do we as coaches glorify God? We treat each each player with dignity and respect. We diligently work to bring about improvement, intensity, and dedication on our teams. We do our best to treat officials, opposing players, coaches, and fans with respect and honor their efforts. We lead, discipline, encourage, and correct our players in the game of basketball and in the game of life. We maintain a line of communication with our players and respect their effort and determination. We support the principles of Manhattan Christian School. We strongly promote academic success as well as athletic success. We show more interest in your child being successful in life and in their walk with the Lord than successful in basketball.

How can parents direct others toward Christ? They encourage their son or daughter. They focus on ways they can help the team, regardless of playing time. They cheer everybody on the team, not just their child. They are good listeners and great encouragers. They support the coaches instead of tearing them down. They thank and appreciate game officials for their willingness to serve even if they don't appreciate the quality of the officiating.

How can fans direct others toward Christ? Break down barriers that may have been created between our community and our opponents' fan base. Develop relationships and complement opponents. Start a conversation with someone from a visiting team, someone you've never met before. Be positive. Model appropriate behavior. Be welcoming and hospitable to those entering our amazing athletic complex and if you're at another facility, clean up your area before heading home.

As Christians, we are not doing this to draw attention to ourselves. We want to be a light on the Hill so that it draws others to the body of Christ. We have a tremendous opportunity as a community to show Christ's love to others. Let's work together to do this as a community that loves the game of basketball.
















Twice Treasured Thrift Store Holiday Hours

From the Manhattan Christian School Board

The MCS board is deeply appreciative of the involvement of our community in this endeavor we call Manhattan Christian School. The Vision of this community is to: cultivate growth within our students in knowledge, conviction, and maturity; create a dynamic vision of Christ's Lordship; nurture a personal relationship with Jesus Christ that develops a Christ-like love demonstrated to all people; and inspire each other to strive for His glory in all of life.

As truth remains under attack: walking down the street, entering a library, glancing at our phones, seeking news, and interacting with our world, each requires a great amount of wisdom and discernment. So also in education we must remain vigilant and aware as the godless agendas of our day become mainstreamed in the secular education system. We are grateful to have the 100+ year history of doing that at MCS and will continue to hold to our Reformed faith that confronts our culture with the truth of sin, God's sovereignty and His gracious redemptive plan. Although the world around us may be in crisis, His Kingdom is not!

There are many things here at MCS that are important to carrying out our purpose and we seek to foster a culture of growth in quality. None is more important than our staff. As a board we are extremely thankful for their love for God, the calling he has given each of them here at MCS, and their diligence in pursuit of that calling. Although not perfect, they are committed, invested, and discerning as they teach and interact with our kids each and every day. Supporting, encouraging, teaming with, and trusting our teachers is implicit as we pursue our mission. A culture of quality means that when you do have questions or concerns, bringing them to your children's teachers in a 'speaking the truth in love' manner will enable us to grow together.

MCS' policy holds us accountable to our mission and vision, and to our Association. That policy speaks to our curriculum. It provides for a 5 year cycle that ensures each of our curriculums are reviewed on a regular basis. In addition, this year we have added a part time curriculum coordinator and moved our counselor position from half time to full time to help in this effort. Although this cycle doesn't always result in a new curriculum, this year it has brought about the implementation of a new math curriculum, and currently we are reviewing our English Language Arts, Bible, and Social Emotional Learning(SEL) curricula. As noted in previous communications, we have been analyzing our current SEL and investigating other options in pursuit of a tool that aligns with our mission and vision, recognizing Christ's Lordship over 'every square inch' of who we, as created in God's image, are. The board has mandated this to be completed before next school year. SEL will continue to be used only in grades K-5, as it has been in the past. It would be wonderful if a rigorous Christian curriculum existed for every area of education, unfortunately this is often not the case. Our policy ensures we will continue to evaluate and pursue God glorifying tools for our faculty to implement.

We acknowledge there may still be some confusion generated over what SEL is. If that is you, we encourage you to talk to your children's teacher or MCS administration if you haven't already. Although this terminology is somewhat newer (in the last 20 years). The practice has been around as long as teaching and is simply "whole person" education. This is at the core of what we pursue at MCS. A seasoned teacher with years of experience likely does this very naturally and may not need or use a curriculum, while a younger teacher may benefit greatly from some tools that help them work through specific behavioral lessons or situations. Often this can be implemented to enable the application of a Bible lesson. It does not, nor will it ever, take precedence over God's word, rather, like Algebra, may grow out of our understanding of His world and what it means to be human. Regardless of experience or youth, as noted above, we aim to give our teachers access to tools they find useful and appropriate and trust they will continue to discerningly utilize them in the education of the hearts and minds of our students living and learning in a fallen world.

We understand that in our polarized and hyper politicized age there will be varied views and opinions on many curriculum choices. We ask that you continue to partner with us in a spirit of trust and teamwork and not a spirit of fear. It is implicit in the Biblical worldview that results in schools like MCS, that first and foremost, parents are given the responsibility for their children's education; second, schools can assist in providing vocationally appropriate teachers of technical and complex subject matter and, corporately, other important resources and assets; and third, that this dance between parents and schools occurs inside the understanding that God's covenant people educate their children, heart, soul, mind and strength, in a way that recognizes Christ's Lordship over all. In that understanding, we welcome future conversations and pledge to listen to you and ask that before reaching a conclusion, you will also listen in return. As members of the body of Christ we are commanded to speak the truth. We are also commanded to do so in love. Communications that seek to undermine the school as a whole or the personhood of our staff are not appropriate. While we will disagree about many things along the way, we must continue to keep at our center Christ. On a more micro level, our center may be defined as: MCS inspires students to live God-glorifying lives by teaching Christ's lordship in faith, learning and living. Let's continue the messy calling to Glorify God, pursue excellence and provide correction, reproof and training in righteousness TOGETHER as His body.


