#### Strategic Planning Over a Cup of Jo

Today we began our Tuesday morning coffee program, and I was so thankful that over a dozen of you showed up to discuss the future vision for the school. We had a great discussion of the main goals of the MCS Strategic plan, and I received some great input that will help guide its final draft which will come before the association for a vote in May.

#### The five main goals of the plan are as follows:

- 1. Spiritual Life: Establish a culture that prepares students to apply a biblical framework to their academic studies, so they can thoughtfully address the important issues found in their future studies and vocations. Provide service opportunities, hire Spiritual Life Director, increase Bible curriculum offerings.
- 2. Increase Academic rigor: Assess and revamp curriculum, increase course offerings available to students, strengthen faculty development program, strengthen assessment capabilities.
- 3. Facility Improvement: Elementary/Middle school building and refurbishment project started, Revamp safety and security policy and procedures, increase staffing in key areas (janitorial/facilities).
- 4. Create a financial plan that continues to provide full funding for the school with no operating deficits, while wisely stewarding the resources of the school and school community. Create a multi year budget and streamline financial operations.
- 5. Re-establish Fine Arts Excellence: Establish excellence in the music program, while increasing the overall emphasis on music/arts and theater.

We will continue to meet on Tuesday mornings throughout this month at 8:15 in our new coffee shop area. Come, have a coffee, hot chocolate or tea and let's talk some more. We really value your inputs to the process!


