#### 2024-'25 Tuition Assistance & ACE Scholarship Updates & Deadlines

Manhattan Christian partnered previously with TADS to evaluate financial need information for families applying for tuition assistance. ACE Scholarships partners with **FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment** for their application processing. In an effort to streamline the tuition assistance application for our families, Manhattan Christian will be utilizing **FACTS** for our application process as well.

ACE Scholarships will accept applications through **11:59 p.m. on April 15th**. The application must be completed in its entirety by the deadline (including uploading required tax documents) for students to be eligible. New MCS students whose families meet income qualifications and students renewing ACE scholarships will be given priority for award. Please follow the ACE link at manhattanchristian.org to apply for a scholarship.

Beginning in early April, families applying for MCS tuition assistance must complete a FACTS application and submit necessary supporting documentation. The deadline for the first round of awards is April 19, but MCS will accept applications throughout the summer. Once the portal is open, a link will be provided through our website at manhattanchristian.org or directly at <a href="https://online.factsmgt.com/aid">https://online.factsmgt.com/aid</a> (MCS Institution ID is #20375).
