We believe the total educational program of the Christian school should be designed to orient the child to a life in Christ, for fellowship with and service to God and his fellow man.

Earlier this year, the veteran social researcher George Barna released a shocking new report describing the HUGE faith crisis hitting our young people. He reports that, "between the ages of 18-22, the number of young people calling themselves committed Christians SHRINKS BY NEARLY HALF... to just 17%."

Why are they walking away? They are under assault every single day. I've never seen spiritual warfare this intense. From open attacks on Christianity, the constant bombardment of social media and the call to compromise, our students are living in difficult times. Think about that again: about half are giving up. Denying their faith. Turning away from Jesus.

Our goal here at MCS is to provide a place where students learn the truth of Scripture and their identity in Christ. We want them to know how to live in the world without being of the world. We want to prepare them to change the world for Christ. We need your help to do that!

After three straight years (and more, I believe, since before I coached) of dropping the Friday night semi-final match and working our way back up, the girls played some of their best volleyball (certainly their best serving) to come back from a deficit in the first set against North Country for a 3-0 win to finally see the championship match through the winner's bracket. Personally, I think it was the tinsel in their hair and Hanna's proposition that she would even take some for Saturday if they won Friday night. We coaches all noted how special it was to see all of the girls play their role at State so well. 

# **Cross Country Boys Win their Eighth Straight**


Oren Wins His Third Straight and Girls Place Seventh

to chamber music and this level of musicianship was a true treat for the students. Students also had the chance to learn fun facts about the saxophone family.



# Manhattan Christian Football: Year One

Si vis Pacem, para bellum is a Latin phrase that means, "If you want peace, prepare for war." The paradoxical nature of the phrase is inherent in football, as in Paul's exhortation to the Corinthians, "Be watchful, stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong. Let all that you do be done in love." 1 Corinthians 16:13-14

Success in football requires physical exertion, with an understanding of potential outcomes. Teaching our guys to find the balance was a primary goal in our inaugural season. We elevated this responsibility because it translates naturally from the football field to the life of young men. On and off the field we need men to pursue peace while embracing the reality of conflict.

Through the summer and fall, the team studied through the life of David. King David is remembered simultaneously as a man after God's heart and a warrior who shed too much blood to be the builder of God's temple. In weekly small groups, we discussed how and why David withheld his hand against Saul yet unhesitatingly confronted Goliath.

Physicality does not necessarily lead to conflict. Those who took the field against us, as well as those watching, experienced the results of men unafraid. At the same time, we saw the impact of men pursuing peace with their opponents.

This season gave us many reasons to be proud of our guys. Some made splashy in-game plays. Others acted humbly in the face of disappointment. A number gave their all day-to-day with little outside appreciation. Together they competed for a goal exceeding personal glory.

Throughout the season we were warned that opponents had it out for us because of our success in other sports or because we are a Christian school. That may have been the case. However, after the game, coaches, players, and referees frequently commented on the way our guys played. This is the fruit of a team pursuing peace as they prepared for war.

Finishing with six wins and three losses made for a successful season. Competing in a way that others may know we play for God's glory, made it a good season.


