# Safety Reminder

I take the safety and security of your kids and my staff very seriously. Two years ago, the Board voted to enact a policy to allow selected and trained staff to be armed. Weapons are not carried at all times, and when they are not carried they are in biometrically activated safes.

There is a training protocol required and our ultimate goal is your child's safety. We don't announce this with signs, but as I hear discussions around town, it seems everyone knows we are an armed campus. I want anyone with evil intentions to know this will not be an easy place to attack. We have changed the entry control system to modernize and control access. Everyone seemed to have a FOB allowing them access to the school, and that has changed. We must control access to this building. That is why I tend to go ballistic when I see doors propped open with rocks and left unattended or simply left unlocked after an event. We've also had an increase in suspicious vehicles and people parking in our parking lot. I had a car towed recently after consulting with the Gallatin County Sheriff and will continue to do so as required. Please help us in this effort. Keep an eye out for the school. If something looks out of place or suspicious, please let me or anyone on our staff know immediately. Please ensure the weapons you possess are safe and secure, and if you hear of any threats to the school, let me or law enforcement know immediately.

I am a big fan of Nehemiah, who trusted the Lord when threatened but simultaneously took action to prepare for that possibility. Workers worked on the wall but were also armed and ready to respond. In these times, we must have that same mindset. Thank you for your support!
